**【Inbound to Tokyo University of Agriculture and Technology (TUAT) 】**

TUAT Response to Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) Outbreak

Regarding students newly entering Japan for the purpose of studying at TUAT, and TUAT students currently staying overseas and entering Japan from overseas, we inform that TUAT has decided to implement the following measures in relation to COVID-19 outbreak. These measures involving travels and travelers entering Japan are based on Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) of Japan - Overseas Safety: Infectious Disease Risk Information.

**( 1 ) All TUAT students entering Japan from overseas:**

**Students who have stayed, visited even temporarily, or transferred from any countries/regions (China, Korea, Europe, Iran, etc.) with Level 2 or above according to Infectious Disease Risk Information and is returning to Japan**

**【Before Entering Japan】**

1. Any student, who feels ill, with a fever or cough, or experiences any difficulty breathing or other problems with their respiratory tract, at any time during the two weeks (14 days) prior to entering Japan, **must postpone their travel.**
2. Inform your TUAT supervisor for your expected date of entering Japan.

**【After Entering Japan】**

3. After entering Japan, students must stay and monitor themselves for any abnormalities in physical condition at their residence for the duration of 14 days, and refrain from having close contact with other people.
4. Students are encouraged to wash their hands and gargle frequently. When going outside, wear a mask.

5. Any student who feels ill, with a fever or cough, or experiences any difficulty breathing or other problems with their respiratory tract, should immediately seek the advice of TUAT Health Service Center via phone.

**(2) All students planning to enter Japan from overseas for the purpose of studying at TUAT:**

- ① Students newly entering Japan from any countries/regions (China, Korea, Europe, Iran, etc.) with Level 2 or above according to Infectious Disease Risk Information, for the purpose of studying at TUAT:

Postpone your travel to Japan from any countries/regions (China, Korea, Europe, Iran, etc.) with Level 2 or above according to Infectious Disease Risk Information. Re-plan your travel to Japan after ensuring the departing country/region's risk level has dropped to Level 1 or below.

- ② Students newly entering Japan from a country/region with Level 1 or below according to Infectious Disease Risk Information, for the purpose of studying at TUAT:

**【Before Entering Japan】**

1. Any student entering Japan from overseas must ensure the departure requirements of the country they wish to depart from.
2. Any student, who feels ill, with a fever or cough, or experiences any difficulty breathing or other problems with their respiratory tract, at any time during the two weeks (14 days) prior to entering Japan, **must postpone their travel.**

**【After Entering Japan】**

3. Students are encouraged to wash their hands and gargle frequently. When going outside, wear a mask.
4. Refrain from having close contact with people who are sick with a fever or cold-like symptoms.
5. Avoid contact with live/dead domestic animals and wild animals including

ones in markets.

6. Any student who feels ill, with a fever or cough, or experiences any difficulty breathing or other problems with their respiratory tract, should immediately seek the advice of TUAT Health Service Center via phone.

“Infectious Disease Risk Information” provides useful information on infectious disease such as COVID-19. Countries/regions which require special attention when people from Japan travel or stay abroad are classified by level.

Level1	Exercise caution	Stay alert to the security situation.
Level2	Avoid Non-essential travel	Avoid non-essential travel. Stay alert to the security situation. Take appropriate safety measures.
Level3	Avoid all travel	Avoid all travel regardless of purpose. Consider the possibility of evacuation.
Level4	Evacuate & Avoid all travel	Evacuate immediately. Avoid all travel regardless of purpose.
