TUAT Response to Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) Outbreak

Regarding TUAT students planning to go abroad, we inform that TUAT has decided to implement the following measures in relation to COVID-19 outbreak. These measures are based on Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) of Japan - Overseas Safety: Infectious Disease Risk Information.

【Before Going Abroad】

1. Postpone your travel to any countries/regions (China, Korea, Europe, Iran, etc.) with Level 2 or above according to Infectious Disease Risk Information.
2. Any student, who feels ill, with a fever or cough, or experiences any difficulty breathing or other problems with their respiratory tract, at any time during the two weeks (14 days) prior to leaving Japan, must postpone their travel.
3. Any student, who has stayed, visited even temporarily, or transferred from any countries/regions (China, Korea, Europe, Iran, etc.) with Level 2 or above according to Infectious Disease Risk Information at any time during the two weeks (14 days) prior to leaving Japan, must monitor themselves for any abnormalities in physical condition at their residence for the duration of 14 days after returning to Japan from Level 2 or above country/region mentioned above. They must also refrain from having close contact with other people and postpone their travel.
4. Students should obtain a consent of the family (parents, etc.) for their travel.
5. Students should have hospital contact information of the destination handy, in case they require to seek medical advice.

【While Travelling Abroad and Staying Abroad】

6. Students are encouraged to wash their hands and gargle frequently. When going outside, wear a mask.
7. Refrain from having close contact with people who are sick with a fever or cold-like symptoms.
8. Avoid contact with live/dead domestic animals and wild animals including ones in markets.
9. Any student who feels ill, with a fever or cough, or experiences any difficulty breathing or other problems with their respiratory tract, should immediately receive medical observation from a doctor.
10. In case, the country/region of destination's risk level has raised to Level 2 or above while travelling

abroad or in transit, please follow the directions from TUAT. After entering Japan, students must stay and monitor themselves for any abnormalities in physical condition at their residence for the duration of 14 days, and refrain from having close contact with other people.

Level1	Exercise caution	Stay alert to the security situation.
Level2	Avoid Non-essential travel	Avoid non-essential travel. Stay alert to the security situation. Take appropriate safety measures.
Level3	Avoid all travel	Avoid all travel regardless of purpose. Consider the possibility of evacuation.
Level4	Evacuate & Avoid all travel	Evacuate immediately. Avoid all travel regardless of purpose.
